Tools To Help Stores Find American-Made Furniture

The idea of spending the rest of his life in the mobile home factory didn't appeal to thirty-year old William. He already had some calves and a small pig farrowing operation on the farm that he and his wife, Phyllis Ann, purchased a few years earlier. A refurbished silage bunker and the old bank barn kept the animals under shelter.

While brainstorming ways to get out of the factory, William found a small hydraulic unit that was perfectly sized to power a small woodworking shop. Pushing the pig pens to one end of the old silage bunker, he started building crafts. Slowly, the crafts morphed into benches and eventually bedrooms, which proved to be the company's sweet spot.

As the silo bunker/pig pen transitioned into a woodworking shop, William needed a name for his business. Earlier curiosity had driven him to research the crooked road that linked their farm to the nearby towns of Shipshewana and Howe. Many of the local Indiana roads where straight as arrows, but County Road 450N was an exception. William learned the road had once been a popular Indian trail. Over time, the trail had widened but kept its meandering ways. In 1994, Indian Trail Furniture was born.

Demand for the company's furniture increased rapidly. As the business grew, space became an issue. In 1997, the company added a 20' x 80' addition that connected the old silage bunker to the bank barn. Finally, the bank barn was also converted into furniture production space.

One day, a local carpenter named Jerry Miller stopped by. As the men chatted William mentioned that his buildings were too small, and they couldn't push out the perimeters any further. Before they parted ways, Jerry remarked, "If you ever need help, I could take it on." William remembered the offer and contacted Jerry in 1997, giving him the opportunity to build all the case-goods for Indian Trail Furniture.

Through that, J & R Woodworking and Indian Trail Furniture began a long, healthy relationship. William and his team design and produce beds, while J & R Woodworking creates dressers, nightstands, and cabinets to match. "We feel fortunate to work with their company," William stated during our interview.

Combined, the two companies produce an impressive array of bedroom furniture. More than eighty-three different beds are shown in their catalog, and thirty-six of these beds feature complete case-good sets. Bed styles include day beds, Murphy beds, wall units, bed seats, and platform style beds. There are heritage beds, traditional styles, and modern versions. Wood options are almost as expansive with more than a dozen species to choose from, including the popular Brown Maple, Rustic Hickory, and Rustic Rough-Sawn Brown Maple.

"Our goal is to keep pace with the changing styles. We try to cover a variety of styles, asking dealers what they are seeing and then follow the trends. We work on this every day," William told us. He noted that dealers advised them not to stray from the massive, big-boned furniture, which has become a trademark characteristic of Indian Trail beds. "We are known for the tall beds and big posts." William explained.

Indian Trail is aiming to launch three new styles later this year. From early feedback, it looks like a new Arch bed style will be popular. This is a traditional style with strong geometric shapes. A Queen Anne bed and an ultra-modern bed are also in development.

Today, three of William's sons, Alan, John, and Lavern, work for Indian Trail Furniture and are planning to purchase the business from their father. Nineteen employees keep the company buzzing with activity, producing some of the finest beds in America and smiles for their happy customers. The old bank barn has been torn down and in it's place, new 30,400 square foot building is being constructed. The company is hoping to have the new building in full production by November of this year.

William and his wife, Phyllis Ann, are the owners of Indian Trail Furniture. They raised a family of 5 sons and 3 daughters. William serves as a deacon in his local Amish Church. In his spare time, he enjoys tending to his two beehives, which have rewarded him with twelve gallons of honey this year.

Since the Neolithic period, furniture has been cemented into place as an essential part of the human experience. Although we often take them for granted, the chairs, tables, beds, and cabinets in our homes add comfort and ease to daily life.

But home furnishings carry another crucial responsibility. Humans crave beauty, and we all have an inborn desire to surround ourselves with objects of beauty. Although unquestionably functional in nature, furniture has not filled its mission until it soothes the senses of the people that enter its space. At first glance, function and beauty seem antagonistic to each other, but when properly merged into interlocking oneness, they create a deeper beauty and a complete functionality. Furniture design is an art that blurs the lines between creativity and functionality.

THE ONGOING DEBATE

So which is more important? Should beauty or functionality get most of the attention? The answer, of course, depends on the customer and where the furniture will be used. But even so, we rarely see successful furniture designs that only incorporate beauty or only functionality. Either of the characters may be dominant in a given design, but its opposite can always be found, thinly masked right beneath the surface.

Good designers understand the need to create visually appealing pieces while also defining their purpose and practicality. Still, a good design can display beauty and functionality simultaneously, effectively harmonizing the surrounding space. What then, is the way by which we separate the mediocre from the magical? The mundane from the magnificent?

HEIRLOOM QUALITY

American furniture has raised the bar of longlasting, heirloom quality pieces. The country boasts years of craftsmanship and woodworking experience, with skills being passed down from generation to generation. As such, many American manufacturers offer designs that stand the test of time, earning praise from the global furniture industry.

The best designers expertly marry traditional woodworking with modern needs. Amish craftspeople support the market's growing needs by incorporating century-old techniques, like mortise and tenon and dovetail joints, into modern designs. The result? Unique, handmade pieces that are timeless. The extra detail and durability is worth investing in and passing down to later generations.

MATERIALITY

Great furniture invokes a myriad of emotions and inspires action, and it all starts with materiality. It goes beyond aesthetic appeal. Nowadays, fixtures are evaluated not only by how they look, but also by how they feel. In interior design, materiality is the art of creating a symphony of color, texture, and personality in every piece of furniture. It ultimately dictates the overall mood and atmosphere of the space.

Materiality is part of the creative process in furniture design that encompasses every element involved. Joanne Odisho, a Melbournebased furniture designer, earned praise in 2022 for expressing her talent through a blend of timber and bio-materials. She showcases authenticity that stamps a distinctive character on her creations, all through her creative use of materials.

ERGONOMICS AND COMFORT

Relaxation is a huge driving force for the birth of furniture, and ergonomics plays a role in achieving this feat. Great furniture designers will consider body postures and natural movement when building their products. Good furniture provides support, especially in office and living room furniture.


Take the award-winning Moon chair, for example. Designer Serena Papait smartly created a seat that promotes natural posture by relieving pressure from the spine and redistributing support to the knees. It departs from traditional designs yet leaps remarkably high in terms of comfort. Its conceptual innovation gained recognition as the Best of the Best by the prestigious Red Dot Award.

SUSTAINABILITY

The rise of cheap 'fast furniture' is causing a problem in our nation's landfills and waste management services. In 2018, Americans threw out more than 12 million tons of furnishings according to the Environmental Protection Agency. More than 80% of this garbage ended up in landfills, adding to issues like pollution and health concerns.

Now, consumers and designers alike define great furniture design as pieces that are sustainable and environmentally friendly. Sustainable Furnishings Council (SFC) Executive Director Scarlette Tapp reiterates the need for companies

to demonstrate their intentions as opposed to simply declaring it. When shopping for furniture, It is best to find manufacturers that are taking active steps in securing thirdparty certifications and improving their supply chain.

Responsible sourcing is also an important matter in sustainability—where does the material come from? How are they transported? Exceptional furniture pieces worth investing in are ethically sourced by licensed vendors who are meticulous in their processes. It includes using toxic-free coatings and championing up-cycled or recycled materials wherever possible.

TECH-INFUSED DESIGNS

Great furniture designers are not afraid to step out of the industry's comfort zone and explore what innovation can offer. Massage chairs are perhaps a fitting example of technologically advanced pieces that appeal to a niche clientele. From high-precision techniques to adaptive massages, these appliances-cum-furniture are revolutionizing the approach to healthier home living.

AN INTELLIGENT AND RESPONSIBLY-ORIENTED FUTURE FOR FURNITURE

Every great furniture design incorporates the best qualities into a functional and visually appealing piece. With environmental responsibility and individuality becoming more important on the consumer's list, the need for creative furniture designers on the wholesale and retail scene is real. As designers rise to accept these new challenges, it will bring innovation and breakthroughs. A new burst of creativity will arrive, each subsequent invention making our world a little better. Living spaces witnessed a series of style changes throughout the years. In ancient times, emphasis was put on carvings, intricate inlays, and furniture designs that spelled beauty and elegance. These movable fixtures symbolized opulence, expressing grandeur during the Renaissance and Baroque periods.

When the industrial revolution and the eight-hour work day transformed the minds of millions, designers needed to rethink and reshape furniture to fit this new consumer. From elaborate forms, the trend shifted to simple and utilitarian designs. Mass-produced furnishings became the go-to for many consumers, the style adopting a practical philosophy sometimes at the cost of quality. In time this heavily functional form found the hearts of Americans, and the style of modern furniture was born.

DEFINING THE MODERNIST FURNITURE STYLE

The word 'modern' is often interchanged with 'contemporary', but they are unique when referring to furnishings. While contemporary fixtures are a salute to current trends, modern furniture designs are heavily influenced by a specific movement in the early 1900s. In many ways, contemporary isn't a permanent style but rather a way to express a collage of current trends.

Distinctively clean and simple, modern furnishings break free from the larger-than-life pieces of the past. Many creations from the 19th century to the present are inspired by modernism. The design follows specific ideals that have thrived and survived in the giant cultural shifts of the last fifty years.

In general, modernist style furniture has a simple and often stripped-down aesthetic. Nevertheless, it does not fall short of elegance, nor does it have subpar functionality. These pieces depart from the decorative and arrive at a more minimalistic appearance. The design emphasizes geometry, using practical materials and processes involving polished materials, clean lines, and cost-effective techniques.

MODERN FURNITURE & ITS KEY CHARACTERISTICS

Modernist style furniture has been around for decades, but many homeowners and designers still prefer it over other designs. It's the perfect fit for people who want a neat and uncluttered look for their space. There are several defining qualities for this type of furniture with most modern furniture possessing at least two or more of these traits.

GEOMETRIC AND MODULAR FORM

One of the distinguishing characteristics of the modernist furniture style is the use of clean and crisp lines. These fixtures often feature common shapes like squares, circles, and rectangles. It's a stark contrast from the earlier styles that sported elaborate carvings and embellishments.

Often, the elements of modern furniture are modular, fitting together like the pieces of a puzzle. This modular emphasis adds greatly to the visual and practical appeal. For instance, a sectional sofa can have a piece that doubles as a coffee table and storage box. It can be rearranged and recombined in several ways, letting the consumer feel in control and able to express individuality.



MINIMALIST DESIGN

With modernist furniture styles, less is more. The minimalist design of this movement inspired designers to create furnishings that are simple in form. WHAT INFLUENCED THE MODERNIST FURNITURE STYLE?

Modernism is an assortment of ideas that cover various aspects of life including art, design, architecture, and literature. At the core of the modernist movement is the goal of making this world better, simpler, and less cluttered. In the furniture industry, it dismantled centuries of design disciplines and forced furniture makers to create simpler, more affordable, and highly functional pieces. Rather than forcing the human body to adapt to the furniture, the goal of modern furniture is to conform to the user's preference.

The modernist movement empowered America's design sector, and leaders like George Nelson created their legacy in the industry by embracing this movement while it was still in its fledgling stages.

DISSECTING MODERNISM'S CURRENT POPULARITY

How does a movement that's decades old survive and thrive despite the waves of trends and cultural changes? The most likely answer is that modernism is so aligned with the post-Industrial Revolution lifestyle that it simply became the new standard. In many ways the core driving factors of the movement are found in all the nooks and crannies of human experience. Our entire lives are oriented to a Modernist outlook, and we appreciate furniture that embodies these values.

One of the most prominent figures in the history of the American modernist movement was George Nelson, an architect and design writer whose insights still guide professionals today. His perspective of what furniture should be is fundamental in understanding why Modernism became a permanent fixture in America.

WHO WAS GEORGE NELSON?

Geroge Nelson was born on the 29th of May 1908, in Hartford, Connecticut. A promising student, he attended Yale University on the guest to find a career path that befits him. While design was not his first choice, it was perhaps fate that led him to it.

Seeking shelter from the pouring rain one day, Nelson came across an exhibition that inspired him to pursue architecture.

After securing his first degree in 1928, Nelson worked as a teaching assistant. The passion for his chosen profession encouraged him to study fine arts. He received his second bachelor's degree in 1931, all while working on securing opportunities that could broaden his talents. He managed to snag a fellowship from 1932 to 1934, allowing him to attend the American Academy in Rome for architectural studies.

His extensive experience in Rome opened his eyes to modernism and architectural works in Europe. In 1935, he became the first associate editor of the Architectural Forum, an American magazine that touches on home building. His distinct writing piqued the interest of the audience, amassing avid readers in his stead. In his articles, he declared his strong support for modernism, which earned the ire of some colleagues who opposed his opinions.

NELSON'S VIEWS

For George Nelson, design, with respect to the laws of nature, served to improve the human condition and the world. He bravely introduced theoretical concepts that he believed would improve the industry overall. To dive into designing himself, Nelson started co-authoring publications that would later provide significant ideas like a 'family room' in Tomorrow's House with Henry Wright.

In the late 1940s, the renowned design writer introduced a myriad of topics that made waves in the industry. Storagewall tackled the concept of incorporating a storage system within the structure of the home, such as dividers installed directly on walls. This article put the spotlight on modular design, one of modernist furniture's distinguishing traits.

WORKING FOR HERMAN MILLER

His masterful writings, especially Storagewall, put Nelson on the radar of D.J. DePree, the head of Herman Miller, Inc. At that time, the powerhouse furniture company was searching for a new executive after the passing of its former design director, Gilbert Rohde. Nelson was handpicked for the job, allowing him to express his creativity in a more hands-on setting.

For twenty five years, Nelson enthusiastically filled the role, catapulting him to prominence as a prominent figure on the American design scene.

He mainly focused on creating home and office furniture and securing other notable talents to join Herman Miller. During his tenure, he convinced key figures like the Eames brothers, Alexander Girard, and Isamu Noguchi to join the furniture company.

In 1947, Nelson established George Nelson Associates, Inc. to work on creating what would be iconic mid-century modernist products. During his career, he designed pieces that show his ingenuity as a creator. The 'Ball Clock' created in 1950 represents the atom. The 'Bubble Lamp' (1952), and 'Marshmallow' sofa (1965), are just some of his most remarkable works.Nelson also played a prominent role in designing the Herman Miller showrooms in New York, Chicago, and Washington.


UNDYING LEGACY IN MODERNIST FURNITURE



Our quality level is constantly being monitored.

As each item exits our assembly line, it is inspected to ensure that it was built correctly to the customers unique needs, and that our craftsmen did not make any mistakes or miss anything. It is then specifically tagged for that buyer, packaged, and stored in the warehouse until it is shipped.

All our products are covered by a 20-year residential or 5-year commercial warranty from the date of purchase. However, this furniture should actually last a lifetime.

We have had some defects show up with how we fastened our aluminum seat stiffeners. There used to be a problem with the very front board of the seat. Screws were run through the board, on through the aluminum support, then into the seat rail. Expansion and contraction of cold and warmth over the seasons would eventually split the poly board.

Defects like this are completely covered by our warranty. The boards are replaced with our new fastener design and the new design is applied going forward. Now, the aluminum stiffener is first fastened to the seat rail, then the front board is fastened from the aluminum side; thus, hiding the fastener as well. Aluminum is very useful in this furniture, but it has to be designed carefully.

And so, for the past 12 years, our team has been learning about the materials and improving their products and designs. Today, the craftsmen build any of their 450 different items out of their 60-page catalog, from choices of 27 different colors in under 6-8 weeks. Some items are also kept in stock. The products range from seating, dining, sectional bars, cushioned furniture with pillows, swing sets, and gazebos. We hope to continue creating **A piece of mine...**



FURNITURE, HOME GOODS, AND THE WAR AGAINST WASTE

The urgent call for sustainability adopted by the United Nations is slowly but steadily shifting consumer habits. In the furniture industry, stakeholders recognize the 2030 agenda that includes responsible consumption and production. As eco-friendly products become more readily available, buyers are becoming more conscious about their shopping choices.

Is sustainability the right choice? Based on 2019 data, 76% of consumers are willing to spend more on eco-friendly home furnishings. Of these shoppers, 31% agreed that they would pay up to 5% more than their usual furniture expenses if the product comes with an environmentally friendly certification. IBM's 2020 report stated that 80% of North American respondents said that they would want to know the origin of the products, and over 69% of them were ready to pay a premium for recycled products.

Indeed, consumer awareness plays a huge role in achieving global sustainability targets. By 2030, experts forecast that the global market size for eco-friendly furniture will grow to as much as 43.26 million which is still only about 4% of global furniture sales. Once consumer preference and furniture production come in sync, however, ecofriendly furniture could become a very popular trend.

THE MISSING ARGUMENT: LIFECYCLE

According to the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), 12.8 million tons of furniture and furnishing waste is disposed in America every year. As much as 80.1% of this waste is placed directly into landfills. 'Fast furniture' is largely responsible for this alarming statistic. Fast furniture is cheaply made furniture that isn't intended to last long. A recent survey indicated that most consumers expect their new couches to last only three to five years. The mass production of these furniture items makes them relatively inexpensive, but the industry is not yet seeing the full consequence of this 'disposable' mentality.

Unfortunately, most of this waste happens pre-consumer. Furniture that is damaged during transit, especially when imported, is discarded instead of being sent back for repair. A combination of low grade components, long transit routes, and high shipping costs contribute to the decision to discard the damaged goods.

A furniture item's life cycle is a vital, and often overlooked, ingredient in today's shopping considerations. A 2023 study in sustainability emphasizes the role of whole life cycle integration in furniture. Choosing a sustainable design that considers usage time and material sustainability can help to reduce the carbon footprint of furniture.

REPAIRING AND RESTORING

Higher value furniture like antiques or family heirlooms that are made with high quality materials are usually good candidates for repairs. For instance, hardwood furniture can be refinished multiple times if necessary, extending the life cycle by years and decades with proper care. While this approach doesn't make sense with cheaply built furniture, it's often a viable option for higher end, handcrafted products. Many domestic furniture

manufacturers will willingly repair their own products at reasonable rates even if the product is no longer covered by the warranty.

Retailers should begin thinking about ways to streamline these repairs for the consumer and make them profitable for their stores. Developing relationships with finishers, upholstery shops, and furniture repair teams will put retail salespeople into a knowledgeable position.


This concept could be a major selling point for customers who are concerned about sustainability. Demonstrating that they can revamp, instead of discarding, their furniture will ease their environmental conscience and keep them from feeling trapped with their new purchase.

UPCYCLING FURNITURE

Fortunately, there are several ways to uphold sustainability when selecting furniture. While the concept of recycling is well-known, up-cycling is a slightly different approach with an even greater positive impact. It involves repurposing discarded or worn-out pieces creatively, as opposed to breaking down the fixture into raw materials.

With up-cycled furniture, you can retain the historical and sentimental qualities of the item while giving it a new look that fits your desired vibe. This can often be done quite effectively with a new stain or specialty paint.

Creatively reusing a piece of furniture and adding value to it is the essence of upcycling. The process requires a certain creative ingenuity and craftsmanship, which often makes it a good option for interior designers and other artisans.

SOURCING THE MATERIAL

Where and how materials are sourced is a major factor determining the true sustainability of a piece. Natural materials, like bamboo and hardwood, often have a smaller carbon footprint when compared to plastics and composites. Truly sustainable furniture also avoids toxic chemicals and instead utilizes risk-free paints, finishes, and stains.

In the United States, hardwood is often the material of choice because of its durability. It also happens to be one of the most sustainable resources available to the American consumer.

THE SUSTAINABILITY OF AMERICAN HARDWOODS

Experts recognize bamboo as a sustainable choice for furniture and other products. It matures in only five to seven years and thrives in places where other crops cannot grow.

However, bamboo material is commonly sourced in the Asia-Pacific region (65%). Only 28% is

produced in the Americas, and 7% in the African region, and that's where the first problem lies. Shipping bamboo from the opposite side of the globe builds a significant carbon footprint.

This issue is practically nonexistent with American hardwoods since they are grown regionally, often only a few hundred miles from the furniture manufacturer. Dramatically less fuel consumption and packaging are needed when transporting wood materials domestically.

Another factor is the tremendous supply of this natural resource. According to the United States Department of Agriculture, the total number of growing trees increased from 5.2 million cubic meters in 1953 to 12 billion cubic meters in 2017, an increase of one hundred thirty percent!

In addition, lumber is naturally durable and can last generations when maintained properly. Hardwood furniture may last anywhere from 30 to 100 years, without any repairs, depending on the species and construction quality. Comparatively, bamboo furniture typically has a life of no more than fifteen years even when top-grade bamboo is used.

While hardwood and bamboo are both considered renewable, the sustainability standards of the hardwood industry are superior. There

are also numerous uses for wood by-products and manufacturing waste. For example, tree bark can become soil conditioner, while trimmings are transformed into paper and other items.

It is estimated that the US grows more than two times as much hardwood than what is harvested. According to the USDA Forest Service, the country's forestland grew by roughly 33 million acres in the past 30 years. That's enough timber to furnish hundreds of millions of American homes!

HOW AMERICAN MANUFACTURERS UPHOLD SUSTAINABILITY

Eco-conscious shoppers now turn to American manufacturers to provide sustainable furnishings they can trust. How do manufacturers improve the quality of their products to meet consumer demands? Here are a few ways.

NON-TOXIC STAINS AND FINISHES

Natural wood stain is an exceptional choice to enhance lumber's natural beauty while also protecting it. A waterbased wood stain dries faster, has no odor, and will not discolor over time. Tung oil finishes is another natural alternative to synthetics. Manufacturers and retailers should be discussing alternative products with their suppliers.

ORGANIC FABRIC, TEXTILES, AND LEATHERS

Many companies produce eco-friendly fabrics to accommodate the ever-growing sustainable fashion industry. This selection extends to the furniture sector, giving rise to the use of organic fabrics for furnishings.

Some of the most popular options for sustainable furniture include natural fabrics like organic cotton, hemp, and vegetarian silk. Genuine leather is a very durable covering that often has a longer life than fabrics.


